Bellevue Dermatology Post Cryotherapy (Liquid Nitrogen) Instructions:

- You may experience a burning sensation that should subsite after a short period of time. You may take an over the counter pain reliever if desired.
- You may form a blister. This may be covered with a Band-Aid/ and or first aid ointment if desired.
- You may form a scab. These may be ignored or covered with a Band-Aid at your convenience. Do not pick at the scab as it may cause scarring. If the scab is completely dry, it may be covered with make-up.
- The lesion/scab will come off in 2-3 weeks and the area of new skin underneath will be red, white or brown. The length of time it takes for this area to become less noticeable is variable.
- Protect the area from the sun for at least a year. Apply sunscreen and/or cover the area. New skin is more sensitive to the sun and permanent pigment changes can occur with sun exposure.
